As of today, we have 133 students enrolled in our school. This number is significant for several reasons:

Viability and Resources

Our current enrolment of 133 students puts us in a strong position for resource allocation and funding. This number allows us to:

- 1. maintain appropriate class sizes
- 2. offer a diverse range of subjects and activities
- 3. provide adequate support services for our students.

Student Experience

With 133 students, we have achieved a balance that benefits our school community through: Social Interaction, Individualised Attention and Extracurricular Activities.

- **Social Interaction**: There are enough students to foster diverse friendships and social skills development.
- Individualised Attention: Our teachers can still provide personalised attention to each student.
- Extracurricular Activities: We can offer a variety of clubs, sports teams, specialist classes and other activities that enrich our students' educational experience.





Future Growth

Today I'd like to discuss an exciting opportunity for our school's future: expanding our catchment area and increasing our Kindergarten intake.

It has now been confirmed that from 2026 our catchment boundary will move to incorporate the community of Primrose Sands.

This strategic move will not only sustain our long-term growth but also bring numerous benefits to our school community.

Ensuring Long-Term Sustainability

Increasing our Kindergarten intake is a strategic move to secure our school's future. We are aiming to have between 15 and 20 Kinder students each year.

By welcoming more young learners each year, we are:

- building a strong foundation for consistent enrolment
- creating a pipeline of students through all grade levels
- ensuring the long-term viability of our programs and resources.

Community Engagement and Growth

Expanding our reach will strengthen our ties with the broader community. This growth will lead to:

- enhanced opportunities for cultural exchange and understanding.

A larger student body translates to increased funding and resources. This financial stability will allow us to:

- invest in new educational technology
- expand our extracurricular offerings
- provide more support services for our students.

By taking this proactive approach, we're not just planning for today - we're building for tomorrow. Our expanded catchment and increased Kindergarten intake will position us to:

adapt to changing demographics in our area

- meet the evolving educational needs of our community
- maintain our reputation as a leading educational institution.

Reading

This year we will continue to focus on one of the most essential skills for lifelong learning - **Reading**. Reading not only expands our knowledge and imagination but also fosters empathy, creativity and critical thinking.

We will be implementing engaging reading programs and activities to ensure that every student develops a love for reading and becomes a confident reader.

Positive Behaviour Support System

Another important aspect of our school culture is our **Positive Behaviour Support System**. This system encourages positive behaviours by recognising and rewarding students for upholding our five values - **Connection**, **Courage**, **Growth**, **Respect** and **Responsibility**.

We believe in the power of intrinsic rewards, which motivate students to do their best not just for external recognition, but because they genuinely feel proud of their achievements. This approach helps build resilience, self-esteem, and a strong sense of community.

Throughout the year we will also be celebrating our students' achievements and milestones, whether they are academic, artistic or personal. We are committed to providing a supportive and inclusive environment where every child feels valued and encouraged to reach their full potential.

A great way to recognise some of these achievements is through our Values Certificates that are presented by all our staff every Wednesday at our 'Meet and Greets' and through Principal's Awards and Leadership roles.

I would like to thank our dedicated staff for their hard work and commitment to making our school such a wonderful place to learn and grow. To our parents - your support is invaluable; we look forward to working together to make this year a memorable one for all our students.

Students that chose to be a part of this process displayed great courage to be faced with a 3-person panel to advocate for themselves. This year we had a record number of nine students applying for the two positions, which is absolutely amazing to see.

Based on these interviews, students were selected from their ability to speak confidently, making eye contact with the panel, as well as connecting to the values chosen in unique ways, and projecting themselves as leaders into the wider school context. The panel also considered the student's words being backed by actions in their day-to-day life here at Dunalley Primary School.



SAFEGUARDING TRAINING IN OUR SCHOOLS

We all have a role to play in keeping children and young people safe.

This year, there is important training that anyone who works with children or young people must complete. This includes all our volunteers and service providers.

The training is compulsory under new laws designed to better safeguard children and young people in Tasmania.

It will help you understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is or may be being harmed, and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from happening. The training will also tell you what you must report under the new laws.

This simple, online training must be done as soon as possible, and you will need to complete it before you work with any children and young people this year.

Once completed, you will receive a certificate. Please ensure that we receive a copy of the certificate as confirmation that you have fulfilled the training requirement.




Creative Indoor Play at OSHC




