Promoting Road Safety: Encouraging safe pedestrian behaviour and teaching children vital road-crossing skills.

Health Benefits: Highlighting the physical, mental, and social health benefits of regular walking.

Environmental Awareness: Reducing car dependency and promoting the use of public transport to decrease air pollution and traffic congestion around schools.

KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS 2026

If you live in the Dunalley Primary catchment area or have children already attending our school and have a child who will be four years old by 1 January 2026, they are eligible for Kindergarten enrolment at our school.

When enrolling in a government school for the first time, parents must complete the enrolment form and provide evidence of the student's identity, parent/carer identity, place of residence and immunisation details.

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

At Dunalley Primary School it is our policy that all children should wear school uniform:

- To encourage a sense of personal pride and pride in the school
- To put the focus on students' true identities
- To provide a reasonably priced, warm and readily available form of clothing
- To identify members of our school in the community and out of school visits and performances
- To eliminate competitive dressing among students reducing peer pressure and discrimination
- To develop a sense of unity.

All children are to wear the school uniform. If for any reason the uniform cannot be worn on a particular day, a suitable replacement should be worn, preferably in the school colours, and an explanatory note written to the teacher. Alternatively, a uniform can be borrowed from the school's second-hand supply.

Any child that arrives not suitably dressed **will** be asked to modify their form of dress or will be changed into a spare uniform and a note sent home. Parents will be asked to provide an explanation for any uniform policy breaches in order that the school can assist with ensuring appropriate dress in the future.

FOOTWEAR

Black leather school shoes are recommended as they are designed to provide proper support for the feet and back. Due to the daily sporting activities however, appropriate sneakers/runners/ sports shoes in predominantly white or black are allowed. However, this does not include fashion shoes such as Hi Tops, skate shoes and basketball shoes which are inappropriate and often dangerous for sporting activities. Laces are to be properly tied to provide proper support for the feet.

JEWELLERY

Earrings should be limited to small sleepers or studs. Decorative jewellery, including necklaces and long earrings, pose a safety risk during a range of school activities. Stretchers and or spikes and facial piercings are not appropriate for school or school activities. A watch is permitted.

MAKE UP and NAILS

Students should not wear makeup or coloured nail polish to school.

UNIFORM SHOP

Our School Association has a Uniform Shop on the school site. Parents may visit the school and our admin staff will be happy to arrange any uniform purchases. Cash or EFTPOS payment please.

SECOND HAND UNIFORM

The school has a supply of second hand clothing for purchase for \$2 per item - sizes from 4 to 14. Please see our admin staff if you'd like to check the second hand uniform boxes. Sizes from 4 to 14 available.
