At Dunalley Primary School we celebrate the power of stories and reading, excitement into our classrooms while staying focused on our mission to lift literacy for all students.

Across Tasmania the Department Young Education, Children and People (DECYP) is driving ambitious change through the Strategic Plan for Lifting Literacy. The goal is to make sure every statewide Tasmanian child receives the support they need to read well and with confidence. Actions in the 2024 - 2026 plan include evidence-based, explicit reading instruction for all students, early years phonological screening, building literacy partnerships, and harnessing libraries as central community hubs for reading development. commitment There is clear а both equity and excellence - no child left behind, and every learner challenged and supported. This means not only helping students who are at risk to achieve grade level but also extending students who are already confident readers so they can continue to progress and thrive.

At Dunalley Primary, our School Improvement Plan (SIP) Literacy targets are designed to make a difference for students at every stage of their reading journey. We provide targeted





reading intervention programs, grounded in current research and best practice. These programs identify students who may be struggling and offer differentiated support - including small group and even one-to-one tuition - while systematically monitoring student growth.

Our students are supported to maintain PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) reading growth. The focus is holistic:

- Students at risk receive interventions to help them reach grade-level benchmarks.
- Strong readers are challenged and extended to ensure they continue to make progress beyond the benchmark.
- All students are encouraged to strive for growth and excellence.
- Data-driven teaching and ongoing assessment ensure no gap goes unnoticed, and teachers adjust instruction to meet diverse needs.
- Partnerships with families and libraries promote a love of learning beyond the classroom.

Book Week is the perfect opportunity to reinforce these goals. By celebrating books and reading adventures, we empower students to discover new worlds and build the literacy skills that are the foundation for lifelong learning.

We warmly invite all families and community members to join us for our Book Week Assembly and Parade next Wednesday 20 August at 9:00am, where you can see all our students dressed up as their favourite book characters. It's a great celebration of imagination, literacy and community spirit - we'd love to see you there!


