Dear families,

Planning for Seven Classes in 2026

As Dunalley Primary School prepares to increase from six to seven classes in 2026, the goal is to preserve the benefits of small class sizes. By maintaining classes between 15 and 21 students and accommodating a forecast total of approximately 140 students, the school will foster more effective classroom management, higher engagement and richer student - teacher relationships. Ample research highlights that smaller class sizes - particularly in the primary years - enable teachers to provide tailored instruction, give more feedback and identify learning needs earlier, leading to higher academic standards and improved wellbeing for students.

Smaller classes also help to reduce the achievement gap for disadvantaged students and allow for more active and equitable participation by all learners, supporting both academic and social-emotional growth. This approach strengthens connections among peers and educators, helps students feel secure and included, and ensures no child is left behind in the learning process.





1:1 Laptop Initiative for Upper Primary

Dunalley Primary is already actively working towards a 1:1 laptop ratio for upper primary students, aiming to provide each pupil in Years 4 - 6 with dedicated access to digital technology. The goal is to equip every student with the tools necessary for developing digital citizenship and preparing for the demands of the future, while furthering equality by ensuring that all children - regardless of background - can participate fully in contemporary learning experiences.

Research highlights that 1:1 laptops increase student engagement, enable more personalised and differentiated instruction, and foster improved digital literacy, leading to stronger learning outcomes and smoother transitions into secondary education.

Launch of the Grade 6 Leadership Camp

A major highlight for 2025 will be the inaugural Grade 6 Leadership Camp, piloted in Term 4, with a plan for it to become an annual event held each Term 1. This camp is designed to like resilience. nurture skills teamwork. communication and practical leadership through engaging activities and shared challenges.

Leadership camps have been shown to spark personal growth, self-confidence and a sense of community amongst young people. Such experiences encourage students to set goals, work as a team, and manage adversity - all invaluable for both school and life beyond.

Grateful thanks to Georgee Daly (our Grade 5/6 teacher and AST) for her dedication in organising this camp, and to the School Association for funding quality camping equipment. Their support ensures the camp is equitable, accessible and safe for every student. By removing financial barriers, all students can share in the learning and camaraderie that camping provides, regardless of personal circumstances.

Primrose Sands Bus Tender

Another essential development is the impending tender process for the Primrose Sands bus service, conducted through collaboration with State Growth. This project is a testament to Dunalley Primary's dedication to supporting both families and the broader community by securing reliable and accessible

transport. Such efforts are crucial in sustaining school attendance, family engagement, and community life in the area for the long term.

A big thanks to the School Association for everything done so far - whether it's backing new projects or just being a constant support for students and staff. Having a group that's so willing to pitch in and look out for everyone really makes a difference. NOTIFICATION OF INTENDED EXTENDED ABSENCES

KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS - 2026

If you live in the Dunalley Primary catchment area or have children already attending our school and have a child who will be four years old by 1 January 2026, they are eligible for Kindergarten enrolment at our school.

When enrolling in a government school for the first time, parents must complete the enrolment form and provide evidence of the student's identity, parent/carer identity, place of residence and immunisation details.

ASTHMA



It is vital that you update us on any change to your child's asthma condition.

The people at greatest risk of death from asthma are those whose asthma is not considered severe or whose asthma is not properly managed.

It's also imperative that asthma sufferers take their reliever with a spacer at all times to ensure they are receiving the maximum amount of medication into their lungs.

STUDENTS WITH COLD OR FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS

It is DECYP policy that children not be sent to school if they feel unwell with cold or flulike symptoms including:

- fever
- runny nose
- cough, sore/itchy throat or
- shortness of breath.

If your child attends school and presents with any of the above symptoms, you will be contacted to collect them as soon as possible.

Children should only return to school when they are symptom free.

Your support will assist us to minimise the risk of viral illnesses spreading throughout the school.





SAFE AND ACCEPTABLE COMPUTER AND IPAD USE AT DUNALLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL



At the beginning of each year students and families are asked to read, discuss and accept ICT agreements. Here are examples of the information within these documents.

Kinder - Grade 2 Safe Technology Use:

At Dunalley Primary School we are safe and responsible when using ICT equipment by following these rules:

- I will take care of the school's computers/iPads.
- I will not eat or drink near the computers/iPads.

Grade 3 - 6 Acceptable ICT Agreement:

- 1. When I use ICT equipment, including iPads, laptops and cameras, I will:
 - ⇒ Take care of the school's ICT equipment and treat it with respect.
 - ⇒ Report damage immediately.
 - ⇒ Not eat or drink near the ICT equipment.
 - ⇒ Shut down and restart equipment correctly.

Changing our approach to teaching reading

You may have noticed some changes in the way we're teaching reading in our school. These changes are part of a statewide commitment to ensure every student develops strong reading skills that will support them throughout school and beyond.

Learning to read is a skill that must be taught - it's not something we're born knowing how to do. That's why our teachers are using high-quality, evidence-based strategies to help every child become a confident reader.

Our students are learning to read through structured and explicit literacy teaching. This means they are building foundational literacy skills step by step, with each new skill reinforcing the last. This approach helps students grow into capable, independent readers.

We're proud to be part of this statewide effort to provide structured literacy lessons that are proven to work. Thank you for your ongoing support as we help every student succeed.



Teachers in Prep - Grade 3 in 2025 have implemented **UFLI Foundations** - an explicit and systematic phonics program that introduces students to the foundational reading skills necessary for proficient reading.

It follows a carefully developed scope and sequence designed to ensure that students systematically acquire each skill needed and learn to apply each skill with automaticity and confidence.



Teachers in Grade 4-6 in 2025 have implemented **Word Origins** - an evidence-informed program from DSF designed to provide the next step in spelling, reading and vocabulary instruction for students in middle to upper primary school and beyond.

Designed to follow any high-quality structured phonics program, Word Origins targets student knowledge of the morphological regularities of English, and the etymology, or language of origin, of our vocabulary, and the impact these elements have on spelling, reading, and word knowledge.

INVESTIGATIONS IN PREP

- the importance of play!

In Prep we value student led learning and inquiry and encourage children to explore their strengths and natural interests to ensure engaged and successful learners. This means that we have dedicated Investigation sessions where children access different areas of the classroom to develop their social skills, knowledge and sense of self. Students enjoy playing in the Prep Shop where they practice interactions, sorting grocery items, special awareness as they pack and stack and explore vocabulary and number through catalogues. They also 'check in' to the finger gym to develop their fine motor strength and coordination – essential for writing and cutting! Currently this includes a bear balancing task, some crazy looking bug craft and some interlocking cubes. Students in Prep enjoy completing puzzles individually and in small groups – they have identified this as a "calming" activity and have no trouble completing 100 pieces in about 20 minutes, but some students have challenged themselves to complete a 300 piece puzzle too!

















What we've been up to at OSHC

Over the past two weeks at Outside School Hours Care the children have been busy in the kitchen preparing special treats for the important male figures in their lives. This has sparked many thoughtful conversations about who the special people in our lives are and why they mean so much to us.

In addition to cooking, we've been learning how to safely practice headstands - focussing on proper technique to ensure we protect our bodies while having fun.

With the weather warming up, we're making the most of the sunshine and spending as much time outdoors as possible. The children have been enjoying the play equipment, running around on the hardcourt, and inventing new group games to play together.




